


- Routine vaccination is funded by the Government of Cameroon (30%) and Partners (70%)









Vaccination Coverage

Routine Vaccination Communication



- The Cameroonian vaccination program identified a lack of focus on routine vaccination communication in its 2011-2015 multi year plan:
 - Insufficient implementation of communication;
 - Low level of passion of health district supervisors;
 - Low financing;
 - Low involvement of primary players: opinion leaders, traditional leaders, religious authorities;
 - Lack of training of focal communication people

















Compounding factors



 The recent polio out break with 8 identified cases in 2013-14 shifted focus from routine vaccination to monthly national vaccination campaigns

















Data Collection in Cameroon



- Fieldwork January-May 2014
- Data collection:
 - Qualitative interviews
 - Vaccinators, Parents,
 Community Members, Policy
 Makers
 - Observations
 - 5 Routine and 2 campaign settings
 - Mini Survey
 - 199 parents during a campaign
 - Document analysis
 - Official reports and media broadcasts

Summary of vaccination communication differences



- Fewer interventions for routine than campaigns
- For routine vaccination the majority of the interventions take place in the Health Centre setting
- For Campaigns the majority of the interventions take place in the community and through mass media
- In rural areas Social Mobilisers are used for routine drop out tracking but they are <u>not</u> in urban areas















Contributing factors to limited communication about routine vaccination



- Technical focus in the EPI program
- Donor driven allocation?
- Lack of financing
- Lack of standardization in the health talks
- Lack of training of focal communication people and vaccinators
- Inconsistency in the timing of communication activities for routine vaccination















Some consequences of limited communication about routine vaccines



- Confusion over the vaccination schedule and having to attend the clinic
- Increased delayed or incomplete vaccinations



















- Confusion over being completely vaccinated
- Lack of knowledge from parents about why vaccination is important



















The truth is that I have been hearing about vaccinations but I don't really know whether......it is only when I was pregnant that I knew why I was taking medicine. But now I don't even know why I am vaccinating my child. It is only polio that I know that they vaccinate the child so that some parts of his body won't be weak when they are growing up. Apart from that I don't know about any other vaccine. I don't really know why they vaccinate.
